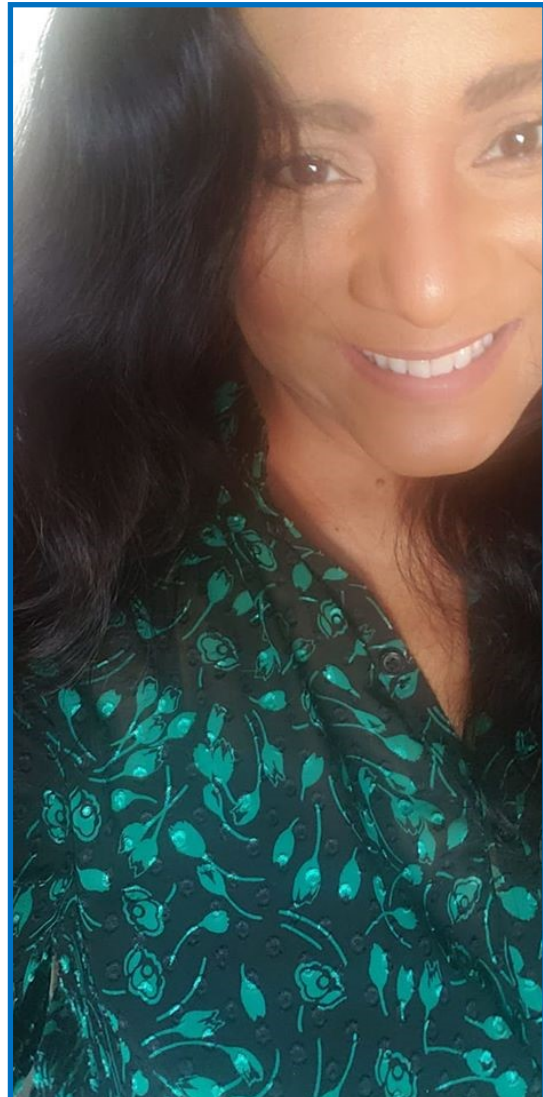

SPMG: Where do you see yourself and Boss Money Habits in the next 10 years?

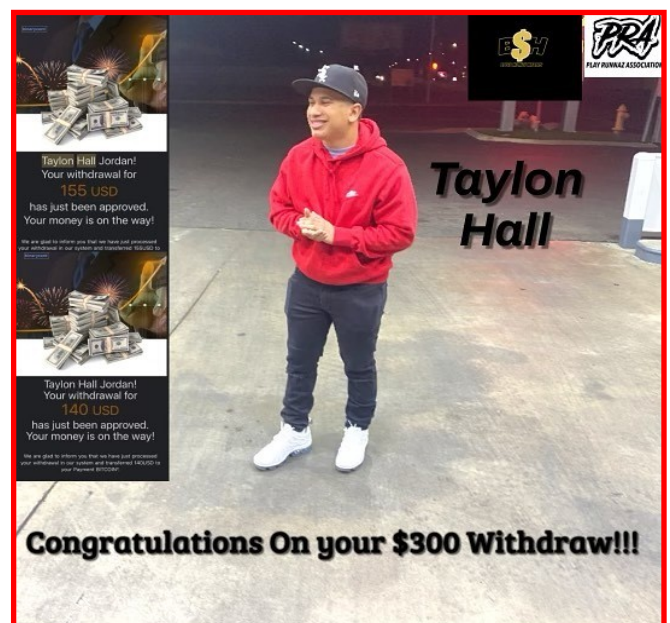

JENNIFER HUDSON

Wins Daytime Emmy, Becoming One Award Short of an EGOT

Jennifer Hudson won a Daytime Emmy Thursday for her role as executive producer in Baobab Studios' "Baba Yaga," putting her one award short of achieving EGOT status.

VR animated film "Baba Yaga," made for the Oculus Quest, won in the interactive media for a daytime program category. Hudson starred alongside Glenn Close, Kate Winslet and Daisy Ridley, who also voiced characters. But it was Hudson's role as executive producer that garnered her the Daytime Emmy Award.

Hudson already has an Oscar, winning for supporting actress in 2007 for her role in "Dreamgirls." She also has two Grammy awards including Best R&B Album and Best Musical Theater Album. All she needs is the Tony Award to

achieve the EGOT. And she came close in 2016, but was shockingly snubbed when the Broadway revival of "The Color Purple" landed four nominations with Hudson missing out.

Should Hudson win a Tony award, she would join the elite group of artists who have achieved the status, including John Legend, Marvin Hamlisch and Robert Lopez. Composer Alan Menken was the last artist to earn EGOT status in 2020, also with a Daytime Emmy win, when he won for outstanding original song in a children's, young adult, or animated program for "Waiting in the Wings" from Disney's "Rapunzel's Tangled Adventure."

Hudson could also land a second Oscar nomination later this season for her performance as Aretha Franklin in "Respect."

In the meantime, she is in the recording studio. Speaking with *Variety* earlier this year, Hudson said, “I am currently recording my... I don’t even know what album this is. Is this the fourth? The fifth?” (She was right the first guess.) “See, I’ve recorded for everything I do,” including film and TV musicals, “so I consider the ‘Respect’ soundtrack an album. To me, I’m always releasing music, but I guess it’s a difference when it’s a studio album. So, with the studio album of Jennifer Hudson, I am currently working on that as we speak — in the middle of all of this, yes.”

She has gone on to co-host *The Talk*, currently have moved from that show and is now making her way to other opportunities.

After spending the last decade breaking ground as a storyteller, Elaine Welteroth has become a cultural and fashion icon, garnering comparisons to fashion journalist André Leon Talley.

Welteroth served as the first black beauty editor of Teen Vogue before her promotion to editor-in-chief of the publication in 2017. At 29, she became both the youngest individual and the second black person to hold an editor-in-chief title in Conde Nast's 110-year history. She is credited with revolutionizing the magazine, expanding its purview from fashion to politics and in the process, capturing the nuances of young women.

When the print version of Teen Vogue ceased, Welteroth didn't retreat from the public eye. Instead, she took on an on-air job as one of three judges on the revamped fashion competition show "Project Runway," the latest iteration of which premiered in March.

"I'm conscious of the projects I align myself with," Welteroth told NBC News. "I hold myself to a very high standard in terms of not perpetuating damaging stereotypes of black women — particularly for the next generation of young black women coming up."

Now, she's chronicling her career in her new book, "More Than Enough: Claiming Space for Who You Are (No Matter What They Say)," which will be released June 11.

She hopes that the book will serve as a guide for women of color who are seeking to make their talents known and appreciated in spaces where they go underrepresented.

"My experience of working in media has taught me that as black women in leadership positions, our unique perspectives are our superpowers," Welteroth said. "I think sometimes the ways in which we shrink or assimilate to gain entry or credibility is a detriment to our ability to really incite change."



As a young girl, Welteroth devoured magazines — even though she said she didn't see anyone who looked like her in their pages. This lack of visibility has fueled her work.

"I know personally the struggle of not seeing myself reflected and how that affected my self-esteem," Welteroth said. "I also know as a journalist and woman of color how systemic these issues actually are."

Beyond her upcoming book and role on "Project Runway," Welteroth recently collaborated with Girlgaze, Dove and Getty Images on Project #ShowUs, the world's largest photo library created by women and nonbinary individuals. The goal of the project, which launched in the U.S. last month at Beautycon, a festival regarded as the Super Bowl of the beauty industry, is to redefine and expand limited notions of beauty.

Project #ShowUs features candid shots of women of all body types with no digital distortion.

"We sell lies about success and beauty on social media," Welteroth said. "I wanted to show the why and the how behind what you see in the highlight reel."

She added: "We've been talking about diversity and inclusion ad nauseam, but we need to see some more strategies and tools that actually help us and deliver on those promises of inclusivity."

Welteroth and Husband Jonathan Singletary

Elaine met Jonathan through church when they were both around 12 and growing up in Northern California. (Their moms still sing next to each other in the choir to this day.) There wasn't a romantic connection until they were reunited as adults in December 2013 when Jonathan came to interview for jobs in New York City, where Elaine had

been living since 2008.

"He reached out to me over Facebook to grab drinks while he was in town," Elaine says. "I was fresh out of a breakup with nothing better to do than meet up with 'that guy from church,' but I expected to be home early." Drinks turned into dinner, then dessert, then a mutual friend's party, then karaoke in one of those unexpectedly fun, quintessential New York City nights that keeps getting better and better until it becomes unforgettable. Jonathan landed a job in music tech, and officially made the move to the city a couple of months later in February 2014. "When my mom came to visit me for her birthday that March, we made a big dinner for her to meet all my friends, and she told me to invite him over," Elaine says. "He tasted my fried chicken. The rest is history!"

I've had the pleasure of meeting Anthony and Melanie Clark for over 10 years. When we originally met, Melanie and I were discussing my difficult relationship at the time and she hit me with an unexpected reality check that I hadn't considered. It was the turning point towards significant life-change for me. I'm grateful!

SPMG MEDIA: It's been a long time since we sat down and caught up! I remember meeting you guys first during our 'Real Talk' Meetings. You've come a long way since then. First, let's give our readers an overview of The Amazing Clarks and the work you do.

ANTHONY: *I'm from Brooklyn New York and Melanie is from Fresno California and we met about 30 years ago in a Fresno Night Club. We were both only in our early twenties and were both recovering from failed marriages. but we also had something else in common. We both wanted to fall in love again one day but we refused to ever again settle for romantic mediocrity. We didn't just want a partner we wanted a soulmate. We didn't just want a relationship we wanted a lifetime of bliss. We wanted the absolute very best that love had to offer and refused to settle for less. But we also realized that we would never achieve those things by following outdated traditional relationship beliefs that didn't work for*

most couples and definitely did not work for us in our failed marriages.

We realized that we would have to create our own road map to relationship success and that's exactly what we did. We spent years using our own relationship and thinking out of the box to figure out what works and what doesn't. We studied relationship therapy, quantum physics, spirituality, and law of attraction and energy. And once we created and mastered that road map in our own relationship we began teaching other couples how to do it as well. And then we began teaching people how to use the same processes to attract practically anything that they want or desire in life. And we've been doing it together as a team for over 22-years and we love it!



SPMG MEDIA: Through your experience, how has the pandemic impacted the relationships of those you've dealt with?

MELANIE: *The pandemic shifted reality very quickly and that pushed lots of people into mourning the loss of their old reality with all of its distractions. Without the distractions people have had to deal with themselves and each other on a much deeper level. Some people found themselves and experienced more passion and joy, while others realized they needed something different after this experience. They either bonded or bounced . LOL*

SPMG MEDIA: What would you say the long-term effect the pandemic will have on relationships?

ANTHONY: *Because this is a universe of duality some couples will experience long-term effects that they'll consider "positive," while other's will experience long-term effect that that'll consider "negative." and then there will be other's that don't experience any perceived long term effect to their relationship because of the pandemic. One "positive" effect I believe some will experience is a greater appreciation for their life and their relationship because the pandemic showed them how easily they can lose it all. Sometimes you don't realize how blessed you really are, until you realize how blessed you really are.*

One "negative" effect will be that the pandemic traumatized millions of couples and made them fearful, hateful, and distrusting. Most of them will never seek therapy and process those emotions. As a result, they'll be like ticking time bombs in their relationships and marriages and that going to end really bad.

SPMG MEDIA: You were recently featured on OWN Network's *Black Love and After Love*. I watched and wow, you were incredibly candid and open about your relationship – both the ups and the downs. Tell us how it came that you were booked for the show and how that has changed your business.

MELANIE: *So, you know about my tattoo? LOL Look we're real people and we have had a lot of life experience, our is just really unique. We love who we are as individuals and as a couple, therefore we love the experiences that got us to the deep love that we share. We have a non profit True Legacy Foundation and one of the board members kept saying you guys should be on Black Love then she attracted a casting call for Black Love and sent them our info. Basically we attracted it. Being on the show has given our brand more exposure for sure. We are now doing a our own podcast The Amazing Clarks Podcast on The Black Love Podcast Network, which has given a platform to share our Love Revolution.*

SPMG MEDIA: For the past 4 or 5 years, the country has moved in a negative direction – lots of conflict, fear and division politically and otherwise. As Coaches, how are you helping your clients get back to the center of love and compassion?

MELANIE: *Our work is our contribution, we have been working together for over 20 years to guide people in the knowledge they can consciously create their reality and we are focusing them on love. Our podcast is literally helping people shift their energy and perspective and be more loving. Its a Love Revolution!*

SPMG MEDIA: In March of this year, you published your book 'Crack the Code: The Secret To Achieving Your Happily Ever After'. What inspired this book?

MELANIE: *At one point or another all people dream of attracting their perfect partner and building their dream relationship that lasts a lifetime. But according to research , the overwhelming majority of all romantic relationships eventually ends in a break up or becomes unsatisfying to either one or both partners. Less than 5% of couples are able to remain together, happy, and passionately in love for a lifetime. And we are honored to be one of them.*

From our perspective, if more couples could have a relationship like ours it would heal this planet and make it a more loving place for us, our children, and future generations. So, for 22-years we've been busting our asses to get the road map to as many one-on-one coaching clients as we possibly could. And we were inspired to write the book because it could give us a bigger platform to reach and help more couples. Even after we are long and gone.

SPMG MEDIA: I love you 'Love Report Cards'. It's a great way to check in to see how you're doing with your significant other through their evaluation of the relationship. What inspired you to develop this check in?

ANTHONY: *We created the Love Report Cards idea in 2005. Most couples would love to keep one another satisfied in the relationship but the day to day challenges & distractions of every day life can make it almost impossible to do. There's work, the kids, dinner, cleaning up, and the gym. And by the end of the day they are both too exhausted to focus on each other's needs. And eventually, their relationship will suffer and they will grow apart or even divorce. We came up with the Love Report Cards to give couples a fast and easy way to consistently focus on each others needs and keep each other satisfied in spite of their hectic schedules. They can be pro-active instead of reactive.*

SPMG MEDIA: With all the challenges we're faced with COVID-19 deaths this past year, you recently did a podcast on The Art of Navigating Death. That's a powerful and timely topic. What are some of the things you're seeing people dealing with that can have a long-term detrimental impact on their quality of life?

MELANIE: *Honestly were seeing people doing more things to enhance their lives. They are learn-*

ing and growing at an accelerated rate. The pandemic woke up their desire to not just live, but to thrive. Does that mean they do not feel negative emotion or get stuck or scared at times, not at all, it just means they've learned how strong they really are in the face of adversity and chaos.

SPMG MEDIA: What can we look for from The Amazing Clarks in the coming year?

MELANIE: *As part of our love revolution we are launching a series of online courses that were really excited about. We want to reach more people and also travel and enjoy our golden years. We are headed to Ghana Africa for a month to see the mother land and work on some of our bigger goals for our business and Non profit. We will continue to do our podcast, coach, speak, and spread love!!*

Congresswoman Cori Bush

Congresswoman Cori Bush is a registered nurse, community activist, organizer, single mother, and ordained pastor for the people of St. Louis. Congresswoman Bush is serving her first term as the representative

of Missouri's 1st Congressional District in the United States House of Representatives. She is the first Black woman and first nurse to represent Missouri; the first woman to represent Missouri's 1st Congressional District; and the first activist from the movement fighting for Black lives elected to the United States Congress.

Congresswoman Bush has lived the struggles that many in her community face. She has personally experienced being unhoused and evicted and is a survivor of police, sexual, and domestic violence.

Born and raised in St. Louis, Congresswoman Bush graduated from Cardinal Ritter College Prep High School and studied at Harris-Stowe State University before receiving a nursing degree from the Lutheran School of Nursing. She has served her community for more than a decade as a nurse, clergy, and childcare worker. A relentless advocate for the unhoused community in St. Louis, Congresswoman Bush has spent years as a community organizer providing services and aid to her unhoused neighbors in the district.

In 2014, following the murder of Michael Brown Jr. by a now-terminated Ferguson police officer, Congresswoman

Bush spent more than 400 days protesting for justice — leading on the 'Ferguson Frontline' as a nurse and clergy. During the day, Bush was responsible for providing triage-medical care and resources to the community that witnessed Mike Brown's body laying, uncovered, for four and a half hours in the hot St. Louis summer sun. In the evenings, Bush would return to march for justice — surviving police brutality in the process. In the years following, she continued her activism as a co-founder of The Truth Telling Project and as a leader of the protest group #ExpectUS.

Congresswoman Bush is the recipient of the 2015 "Woman of Courage" Award from the Emmett Till Legacy Foundation. In June of 2019, she was selected Top Nurse by the International Nurses Association. In October of 2020, the Jefferson City NAACP awarded Congresswoman Bush their prestigious "Trailblazer Award." In November of 2020, she received the Black Rep's Frankie Muse Freeman Spirit Award.

Like our nation's first Black congresswoman, Shirley Chisholm, Congresswoman Bush is unbought and unbossed, following a campaign in which she took no corporate PAC money. She is accountable only to the people of Missouri's 1st Congressional District and will do all that she can to make sure every single person in her district, in our country, and around the world lives a decent life.

Entrepreneur Timothy Armoo



Timothy Armoo is the 24 year old CEO of Fanbytes, one of the world’s driving Influencer promoting offices, working with Apple, McDonalds, Deliveroo. He has been lecturing the gospel about Gen Z promoting highlighting in BBC, Forbes, Adweek, Business Insider and Tedx just as winning honors including the Huffington Post Entrepreneur of the Year and most “Influential person in advertising” by Evening Standard.

At Fanbytes he and his team join restrictive innovation, imaginative style, and influencer showcasing to transform Gen Z experiences into grant winning efforts that form brand love, buy aim and in particular drive ROI. Also, they do it for associations like the UK Government, Deliveroo, Mattel, Warner and Estee Lauder in more than 15 nations.

Since early on Timothy Armoo has been intensely affected by business and innovation beginning his first organization, Alpha Tutoring at 14 and his second EntrepreneurXpress at 17 which he wound up selling 11 months after the fact. In his second year of college contemplating Computer Science, Timothy began Fanbytes subsequent to perceiving how showcasing to Gen Z was broken.

Brown Estate Winery

Brown Estate Vineyards is the first and only Black-owned estate winery in California's Napa Valley, and is best known as one of that region's most well-regarded zinfandel producers receiving a score of 91 points by Wine Spectator.

In addition to zinfandel, Brown Estate produces cabernet sauvignon, chardonnay, and petite sirah.

This two-generation culmination is an investment made by parents Bassett Brown (from Jamaica) and Marcela Brown (from Panama) back in 1980.

They acquired 450 acres in the Chiles Valley AVA of the Napa Valley after being informed by local family friends that the property was for sale.

Abandoned for some ten years prior, the land and its

two structures – an 1859 stone and redwood barn and an 1885 Queen Anne Victorian home – were derelict.

The senior Browns cut roads and brought in plumbing and electricity, ultimately earning an award from the Napa County Historical Society for their restoration of the residence structure.

They planted zinfandel vines, selling them to established winemakers (including Mike Grgich of Grgich Hills Estate) – for more than ten years.

Founded in 1995 by siblings Deneen, David & Coral Brown, Brown Estate produced its first Napa Valley zinfandel in 1996 and decided to move the winemaking in-house.

The Brown Estate established themselves as a winery to watch in the arena of Napa Valley zinfandel. Simultaneously, in the January 31, 2000 issue of the Wine Spectator, the 1997 Brown Estate zinfandel received a score of 91 points.

In Fall 2010, the Brown family celebrated their 30th year in the Napa Valley, and Brown Estate's 15th crush. The family posted the following message on their Website to commemorate these occasions:

"This year we celebrate our thirtieth year in the Napa Valley, and Brown Estate's fifteenth crush. We thank all of you, with all of our hearts, for your continued enjoyment of our wines and your truly stupendous support of our once little endeavor. Each time you open and share a bottle of Brown Estate, you wrap your arms around us. It is an embrace that we cherish, a gesture that gives meaning to all of the passion and commitment we put into what we do. Thank you for making us a part of your lives, and for being a part of ours. Now onward & upward! The sky's the limit!"

Simone Biles



Making History with Gymnastics & Justice

Simone Arianne Biles is an American artistic gymnast. With a combined total of 32 Olympic and World Championship medals, Biles is tied as the most decorated gymnast of all time. Biles' seven Olympic medals also ties Shannon Miller for the most Olympic medals won by an American female gymnast. Biles is considered one of the greatest and most dominant gymnasts of all time.

At the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Biles won individual gold medals in the all-around, vault, and floor; bronze on balance beam; and gold as part of the United States team, dubbed the "Final Five". At the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, she won bronze on balance beam, as well as silver with the United States team, after struggling with "the twisties", a temporary loss of air balance awareness. Her partial withdrawal, focus on safety, mental health and perseverance were praised. Biles is also a five-time World all-around champion (2013–2015, 2018–2019), five-time World floor exercise champion (2013–2015, 2018–2019), three-time World balance beam champion (2014–2015, 2019), two-time World vault champion (2018–2019), a seven-time United States national all-around champion (2013–2016, 2018–2019, 2021), and a member of the gold medal-winning American teams at the 2014, 2015, 2018, and 2019 World Artistic Gymnastics Championships. Additionally, she is a three-

time World silver medalist (2013 and 2014 on vault, 2018 on uneven bars) and a three-time World bronze medalist (2015 on vault, 2013 and 2018 on balance beam).

Biles is the gymnast with the most World medals (25) and most World gold medals (19), having surpassed Vitaly Scherbo's record 23 World medals by winning her 24th and 25th, both gold, at the 2019 competition in Stuttgart. She is the female gymnast with the most World all-around titles. Biles is the sixth woman to win an individual all-around title at both the World Championships and the Olympics, and the first gymnast since Lilia Podkopayeva in 1996 to hold both titles simultaneously. She is the tenth female gymnast and first American female gymnast to win a World medal on every event, and the first female gymnast since Daniela Silivaş in 1988 to win a medal on every event at a single Olympic Games or World Championships, having accomplished this feat at the 2018 World Championships in Doha.

Biles was born on March 14, 1997, in Columbus, Ohio, the third of four siblings. Her birth mother, Shanon Biles, was unable to care for Simone or her other children – Adria, Ashley, and Tevin. All four went in and out of foster care.

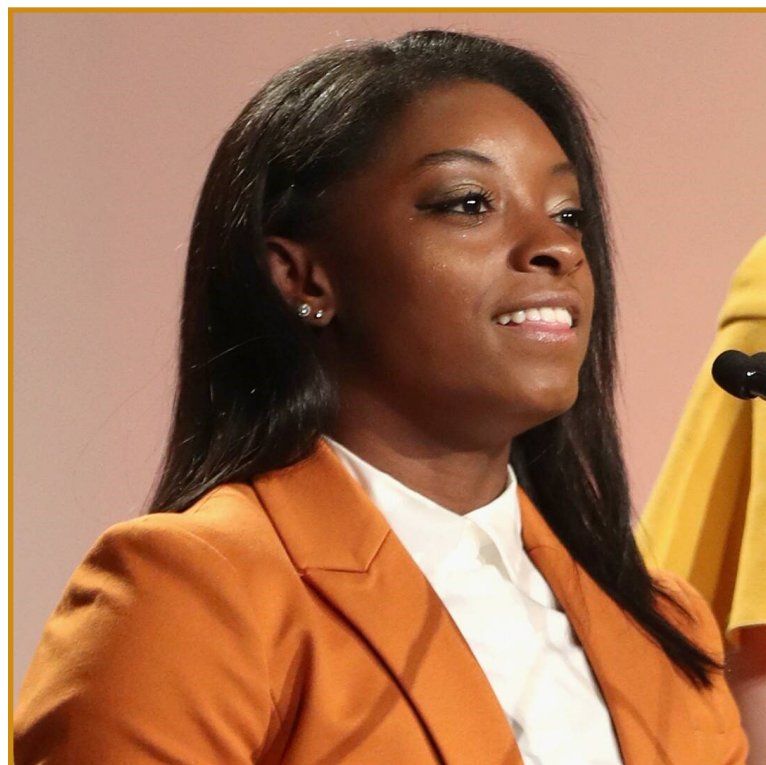
In 2000, Biles' maternal grandfather, Ron Biles, and his second wife, Nellie Cayetano Biles, began temporarily caring for Shanon's children in the north Houston suburb of Spring, Texas, after learning that his grandchildren had been in foster care. In 2003, the couple officially adopted Simone and her younger sister Adria. Ron's sister, Shanon's aunt Harriet, adopted the two oldest children. Biles holds Belizean citizenship through her adoptive mother and refers to Belize as her second home. Biles and her family are Catholic.

Biles first tried gymnastics at age 6 during a day-care field trip. The instructors suggested she continue with gymnastics. Biles soon enrolled in an optional training program at Bannon's Gymnastics. She began training with coach Aimee Boorman at age eight.

Biles began her elite career at age 14 on July 1, 2011, at the 2011 American Classic in Houston. She placed third all-around, first on vault and balance beam, fourth on floor exercise, and eighth on uneven bars. Later that month, Biles competed at the 2011 U.S. Classic in Chicago, Illinois, where she placed 20th all-around, fifth on balance beam and floor exercise.

Biles' senior international debut was in March at the 2013 American Cup, a FIG World Cup event. She and Katelyn Ohashi were named as replacements for Elizabeth Price and 2012 Olympic gold medalist Kyla Ross, both of whom withdrew from the competition because of injuries. Biles led for two rotations but finished second behind her teammate, Ohashi, after a fall off the beam.

At the 2020 Summer Olympic Games, Biles performed the all-around during the qualifications and helped the United States qualify for the team final, in second place behind the ROC team.






Biles dominated Day 1 of the trials, placing first in three of the four exercises with a 2.899 point lead in the all-around. However, she suffered numerous mishaps during Day 2: she bounced entirely off the floor landing on one of her tumbling passes, stepped one foot off the landing mat during her Cheng vault, and took several large stumbles back on her balance beam dismount. Despite these mistakes, Biles still qualified for the all-around final, in first place. She also qualified in first place for the vault final, advanced to the floor exercise final in second place behind Vanessa Ferrari, and qualified for the balance beam and uneven bars finals. She was the only athlete to qualify for all the individual finals.

Biles eventually withdrew from a succession of events due to experiencing "the twisties", a psychological phenomenon causing a gymnast to lose air awareness while performing twisting elements, throughout the Olympics. She noted that while it was not the first time she had had the twisties on vault or floor, it was the first time she experienced them on uneven bars and balance beam. Biles made the decision to withdraw after the first rotation of the team final because she felt that she had "simply got so lost [her] safety was at risk as well as a team medal." During the week, Juntendo University allowed Biles to practice at their gym, located an hour outside of Tokyo, where she could practice quietly away from the public eye.



Some commentators, particularly among conservative media, criticized Biles, accusing her of being a "quitter" or selfishly depriving another athlete of the chance to compete. She was also slandered with racist, sexist, and transphobic comments in the Russian state-owned media, as well as openly accused of being a drug cheat due to her TUE for ADHD.

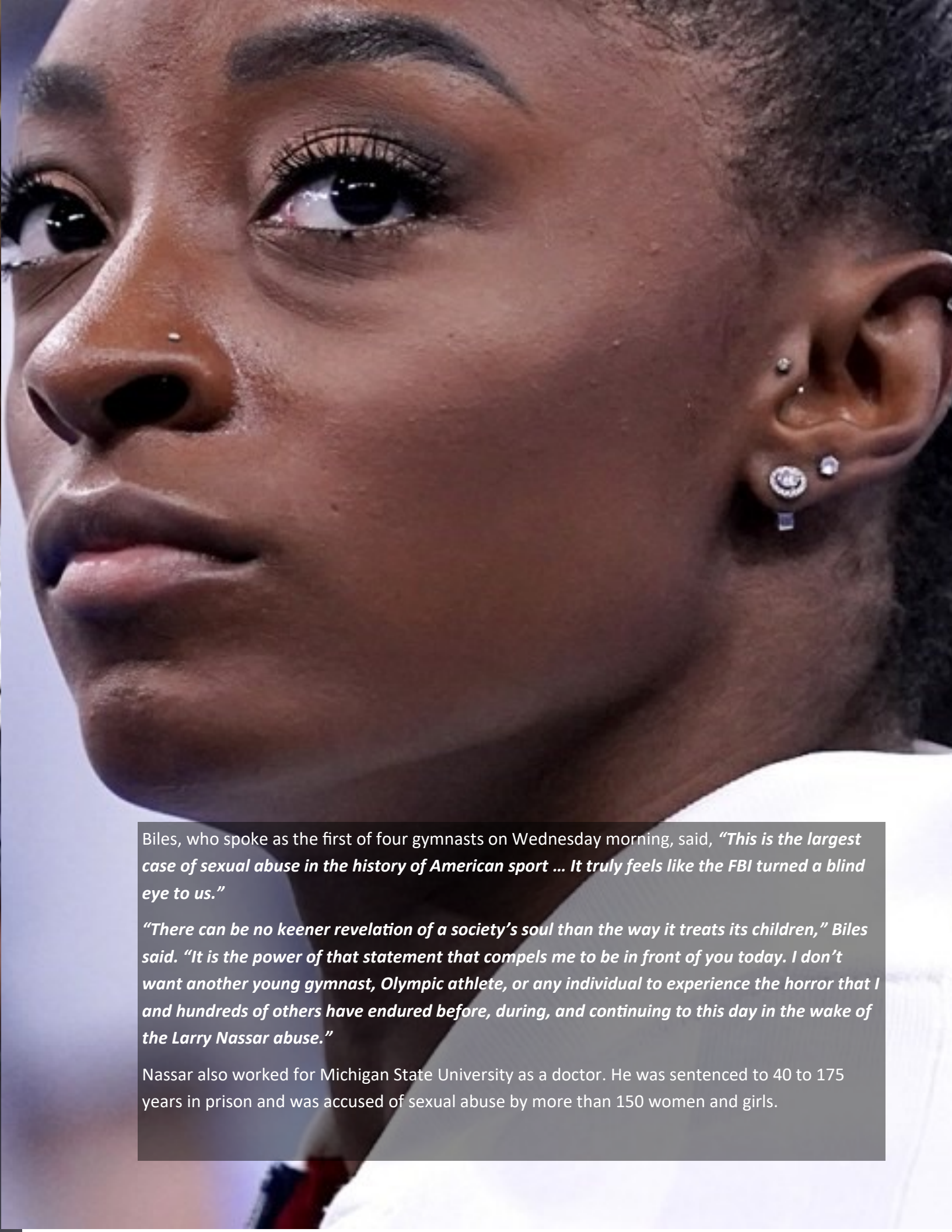

Multiple gymnasts, however, defended Biles' decision and relayed their own stories of struggling with the twisties. Biles' decision to prioritize her mental health was generally widely praised and credited with starting a wider conversation about the role of mental health in sports. Alongside Biles, other Olympians in Tokyo also showed greater willingness to discuss and publicly acknowledge mental health issues, indicative of a wider approach to sport where athletes are prioritizing their health over performance.

On January 18, 2018, Biles released a statement on Twitter confirming that former USA Gymnastics physician Larry Nassar, D.O. had sexually assaulted her. She also named USA Gymnastics for having an alleged role in allowing the abuse to occur, and for subsequently covering it up. She did not attend court hearings held from January 16 to 24, 2018, citing that she "wasn't emotionally ready to face Larry Nassar again." In May 2018, it was announced that Biles and the other survivors would be awarded the Arthur Ashe Courage Award. At the 2018 U.S. National Championships, Biles designed and wore a teal leotard that she stated was meant to honor the survivors of Nassar's abuse, as a statement of unification.

US Olympic gymnasts testified before Congress on Wednesday, September 15, sharing raw accounts of the years of sexual abuse they endured at the hands of convicted sex offender Larry Nassar, the former USA Gymnastics team physician.

The opening statements were part of a Senate Judiciary inquiry into the FBI's investigation into allegations of Nassar's sexual abuse. Simone Biles, among others, said the FBI never followed up with her after she reported the abuse.



Biles, who spoke as the first of four gymnasts on Wednesday morning, said, ***“This is the largest case of sexual abuse in the history of American sport ... It truly feels like the FBI turned a blind eye to us.”***

“There can be no keener revelation of a society’s soul than the way it treats its children,” Biles said. “It is the power of that statement that compels me to be in front of you today. I don’t want another young gymnast, Olympic athlete, or any individual to experience the horror that I and hundreds of others have endured before, during, and continuing to this day in the wake of the Larry Nassar abuse.”

Nassar also worked for Michigan State University as a doctor. He was sentenced to 40 to 175 years in prison and was accused of sexual abuse by more than 150 women and girls.
